



## RIGHTS CERTIFICATE

### GS1 MOLDOVA

1. **GS1**, formerly called 'EAN International', is a voluntary, not-for-profit, international association registered in Belgium. GS1 comprises 101 Member Organisations that operate in their national territories. It manages a worldwide, multi-industry system of standards for the automatic identification of products and services and electronic commerce.
2. **GS1 Member Organisations** are authorised by GS1 to administer the EAN.UCC System in their territory and as such are the sole representatives of GS1 for that territory. To ensure the global uniqueness of EAN.UCC identification numbers and the integrity of the EAN.UCC System, there can only be one GS1 Member Organisation per national territory.
3. **GS1 Moldova**, formerly called 'EAN Moldova' has been a Member Organisation of GS1 since 1995 and is the sole representative of GS1 for Moldova. This means that it is the only organisation authorised by GS1 to administer the EAN.UCC System in Moldova and allocate EAN.UCC identification numbers to companies for their supply chain management needs.
4. **Trademarks.** By virtue of its membership of GS1, GS1 Moldova has the exclusive right to use the 'EAN' and 'GS1' trademarks in Moldova.
5. **Copyright rights.** GS1 Moldova has the exclusive right to copy, translate, reproduce, and distribute the General EAN.UCC Specifications, the EAN.UCC Global User Manual, the EANCOM manual and all other EAN.UCC Standards and Specifications as well as the right to produce EAN.UCC compliant derivative works based on such Standards and Specifications. No other party in Moldova is authorised to copy or reproduce in any form, any part of the aforementioned works without the express permission of GS1.
